## LIBRARY AWARDED "RACING TO READ" GRANT FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD LITERACY



The Poplar Bluff Municipal Library was recently awarded funding to enrich the content of additional story times, and create new programs for early childhood literacy.

Story Time is expanding starting April 25th to include Saturdays at 10:30 am. During Children's Summer Reading (June 1-July 31) there will be another Story Time on Thursdays at 10:30 am. The beloved Story Time on Tuesdays will continue at its usual 10:30 am time.

"Story Time All the Time: Ideas, Tips, and Tricks for Planning Your Own Story Time" classes are open to the public and useful for home, school, babysitting, church or daycare. Held March 30 and again in July, the classes provide ideas and help for low cost, fun story times that really get preschoolers ready to read. Families with children under the age of 5 who attend "Story Time All the Time" will get one free book.

"Story Time at Home" kits are available starting April 25, 2015. The kits contain book suggestions and supplies for a simple craft or activity that make it easier for parents and caregivers to have story times at home, developing reading readiness in early childhood.

The library's Racing to Read grant is supported by the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State.

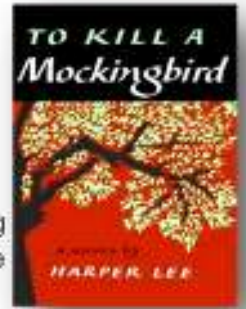

About the Book: Harper Lee's Pulitzer prize-winning masterwork of honor and injustice in the deep south—and the heroism of one man in the face of blind and violent hatred.

One of the best-loved stories of all time, To Kill a Mockingbird has been translated into more than forty languages, sold more than forty million copies worldwide, served as the basis for an enormously popular motion picture, and was voted one of the best novels of the twentieth century by librarians across the country. A gripping, heart-wrenching, and wholly remarkable tale of coming-of-age in a South poisoned by virulent prejudice, it views a world of great beauty and savage inequities through the eyes of a young girl, as her father—a crusading local lawyer—risks everything to defend a black man unjustly accused of a terrible crime.



IN THE NEWS "...An historic literary event: the publication of a newly discovered novel, the earliest known work from Harper Lee ... Originally written in the mid-1950s, Go Set a Watchman was the novel Harper Lee first submitted to her publishers before To Kill a Mockingbird. Assumed to have been lost, the manuscript was discovered in late 2014.

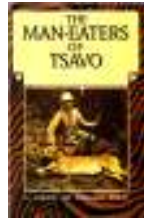
