At noon, Wednesday, May 12, NARFE will meet in the Altrusa Room. There will be bingo at 1:30 p.m. in the Altrusa Room.

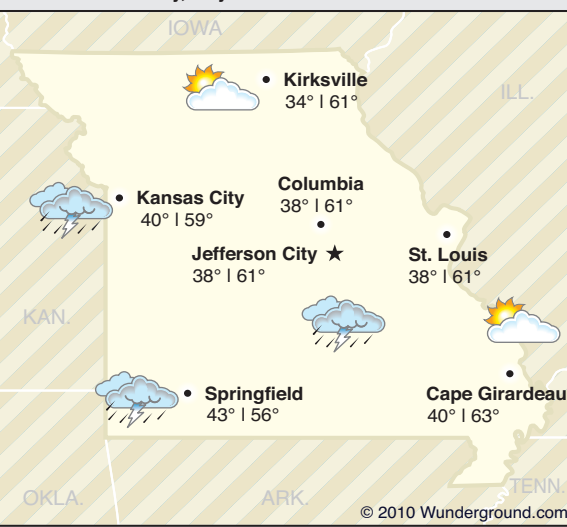
